Mangosteens

Origin: Colombia

Is a tropical evergreen tree with edible fruit grown mainly in Southeast Asia, southwest India and other tropical areas such as Colombia, Puerto Rico and Florida.

Uchuva

Origin: Colombia

In English, its common names include Cape gooseberry, goldenberry and Peruvian groundcherry. The history of *P. peruviana* cultivation in South America can be traced to the Inca Empire.



Passion fruit

Origin: Colombia

Passion fruit originates from South America, specifically from the region stretching from southern Brazil through Paraguay to northern Argentina.

Sweet granadilla

Origin: Colombia

Granadilla is an evergreen climbing shrub, producing stems of up to 5 metres. It grows as far south as northern Argentina and as far north as Mexico.



Pitaya

Origin: Colombia

Is the fruit of several different cactus species indigenous to the region of southern Mexico and along the Pacific coasts of Guatemala, Costa Rica, and El Salvador.

Mango

Origin: Colombia

Worldwide, there are several hundred cultivars of mango. Depending on the cultivar, mango fruit varies in size, shape, sweetness, skin color, and flesh color, which may be pale yellow, gold, green, or orange.





Sweet baby mango
